Standards for Barber/ Beauty Shops are outlined in Chapter 2 of the NAVMED P-5010			Discrepancy
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1. All barber and beauty shop employees medically screened prior to initial assignment. (2-12(a))			
2. Employees wash hands with hot water and soap between patrons and after touching contaminated items. (2-12(b))			
3. Employees wear a clean smock or other freshly laundered over garment while attending patrons. (2-12(d))			
4. Adequate supply of hot and cold running water. (2-13(2))			
5. Adequately lighted and ventilated. (2-13(3))			
6. Shop maintained in clean condition. (2-13(4))			
7. All cosmetic products are approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. (2-15(1))			
8. Sanitary regulations are conspicuously posted. (2-14)			
9. Therapeutic practices, such as treating pimples, ingrown hair, etc., are prohibited. (2-15(2))			
10. Treatment of eye conditions is prohibited. (2-15(3))			
11. Headrest of barber chairs covered with a clean towel or a clean sheet of paper for each patron. (2-15(5))			
12. Common neck dusters, shaving mugs, and lather brushes are prohibited. (2-15(A))			
13. The use of razors or disposable razors is prohibited. (2-15(6))			
14. Employees suspected of having infections or communicable diseases do not attend customers. (2-17)			
15. Only PMA approved first aid materials used to treat small cuts (nicks). (2-15(10))			
16. Individual sanitary neck strips and/ or freshly laundered towels used for each patron. (2-15(7))			
17. Covering cloths changed at least daily or as often as necessary. (2-15(12))			
18. Employees' street clothing stored separately from that of patrons. (2-15(13))			
19. Employees do not eat, drink, or smoke while attending patrons. (2-15(14))			
20. Clean, covered sanitary receptacles provided for waste materials, and lined with disposable bag. (2-15(16))			
21. Removal of cut hair from decks done frequently by dustless method, and floors free of accumulation of dirt. (2-15(17))			
22. Hand sinks and shampoo basins maintained in state of good repair and Cleanliness. (2-15(19))			
23. Soap and paper towels provided at each hand sink. (2-15(19))			
24. All instruments in contact with patrons are be cleaned and disinfected between each patron using and EPA-registered disinfectant. (2-16(1))			
25. Disinfecting solutions are changed weekly or sooner if necessary. (2-16(1))			
26. Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) is available to employees. (2-16(1))			
27. Adequate numbers of instruments and supplies are available to accomplish disinfection. (2-16(4))			
28. Patrons with inflamed or infectious conditions of the scalp, face, or neck are not served without the written consent of the medical officer. (2-17)
